#### **Decorative Raden Design Workshop**

Dates: November 26 tue. - 25 thu.

Insrructors: Yoshinori Musashikawa / Katsuhisa Hata

Raden is a Japanese decorative technique used in traditional lacquerware and woodware crafts. It involves inlaying the iridescent inner layer of abalone shells and various other shells into the piece. Design your own Raden tray with the aogai-nuri technique where you create patterns with the small iridescent shells.

\*Your tray will be delivered about a month and a half later, after the shells are polished and coated. You will be responsible for the cash on delivery shipping costs.

#### What are Takaoka City Traditional Craft Experts?

Takaoka City Traditional Craft Experts are craftsmen who have extinguished skills and knowledge in the traditional industrial crafts of Takaoka copperware and Takaoka lacquerware. As of April 1, 2024, 126 craftsmen and artisans have received this title since its creation in 1967 - 85 for copperware and 41 for lacquerware.

Craft Workshop

Make your own tin plate using cast metal

Instructor: Kikuo Nakamura (copperware, gas molds).

During this tour, you will create your own tin plate by pouring molten tin into a mold. You will carve out your own design for the mold and can take home the finished plate after the workshop. The plate will be approximately 13 cm in diameter.



Studio Tour

Tour Guide: Yoshinori Musashikawa (lacquerware, Raden inlay technique)

Aogai-nuri, a classic technique of Takaoka lacquerware (mother-of-pearl inlay technique using thin shells of about 0.1mm; the white seashells emit a blue glow against the backdrop of a black lacquered base) and the sabie technique (using a paste made of water, lacquer, and whetting powder for design purporses).
